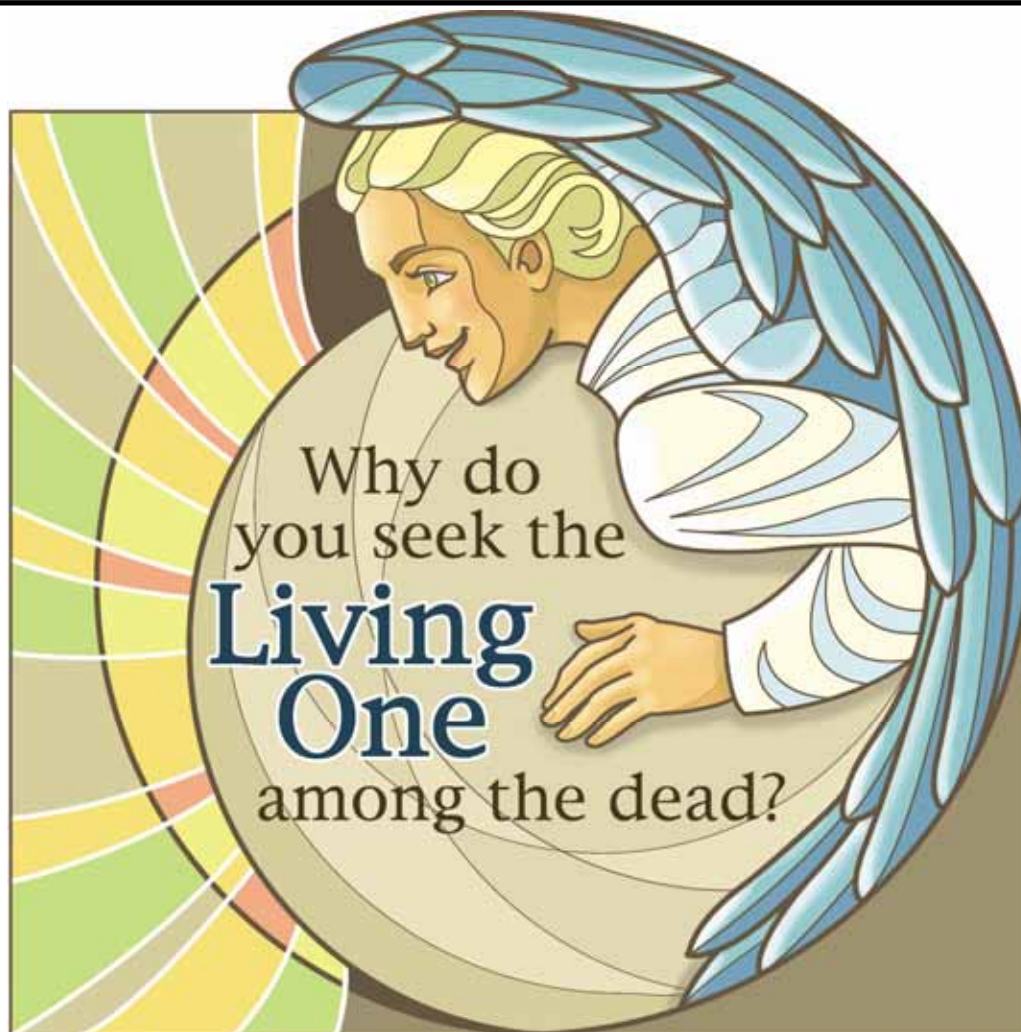

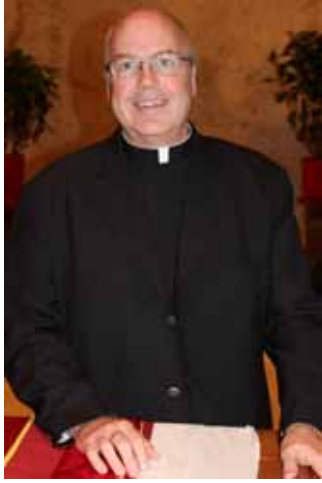

The joy of Easter faith is certainly seen in our new Holy Father, Pope Francis I, as he calls us to the fundamental meaning and mission of the Church – give people hope! While Easter certainly celebrates faith and hope in our future bodily resurrection from the dead, Easter is also a celebration of God's triumph over all forms of death *here and now!* Easter is our belief that we can get through our problems and sufferings because there is light at the end of the tunnel. And this is precisely the good news that Easter gives us today. The dramatic lesson about Easter is not only that Jesus was raised from the dead, but that the resurrection of Jesus is *our* resurrection. No matter what we suffer, no matter how badly we have it, no matter what tragedies we face – even death itself – we will be raised up as well. There is always light for us at the end of the tunnel. Easter promises, in the darkest night of our soul, that our resurrection is closest at hand. It may take great courage, but Easter beckons us to raise our eyes in hope and wait with trust for our redemption. No matter what we endure, God will raise us up. This is the glory of Christianity, the absolute promise of deliverance. With this faith we can face our afflictions not with rigid stoicism, or anger at life, or “why me?” or resignation to fate, but with a patient, peaceful, confident Easter belief that it will be OK. There IS light at the end of the tunnel!

John 29:1-9

Did you know that Mary Magdalene, a woman, was the first to see Jesus' empty tomb and realize the Resurrection? She immediately went to the disciples. Do we live as though the Resurrection makes a difference in our lives?

Perhaps the quality that is most characteristic of Jesus is that of unconditional love. When He was asked about the greatest commandment, Jesus replied "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. . . . You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37-39). Jesus often spoke of love, even the need to love our enemies. And of course His actions were consistent with His expressed beliefs. He loved the people around Him by touching them and healing them. He forgave sin and sent people on their way, spiritually healed. He brought the good news of God's love to all people He encountered. He even loved His enemies by forgiving them while He hung dying on the cross. Jesus' love for humanity was a self-sacrificial love. He gave everything He had; His whole self, His whole life. How much of ourselves are we willing to give to others out of love? On this Easter Sunday, we are especially aware of the life-giving love of Jesus as we celebrate the gift of the Resurrection – the invitation to eternal life. **HAPPY EASTER!**

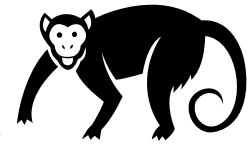

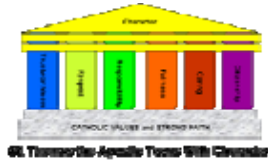

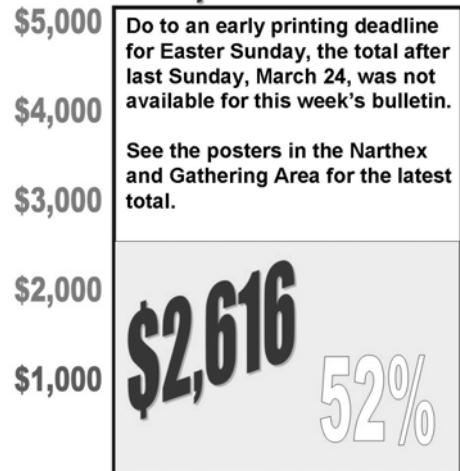
St. Agnes Parish Distributes Winter Clothing and Blankets

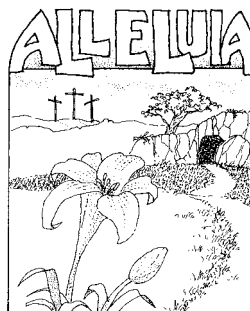
